VILLAGE SESQUICENTENNIAL EVENTS PLANNED FOR JUNE

The Village of Thomasboro will be celebrating its 2014 Sesquicentennial (150th Anniversary) with a series of events on Friday, June 13th and Saturday, June 14th:

June 13, 2014 – FRIDAY NIGHT FREE EVENT

West Side Park will be the location for Kids' Night, from 5:00pm to 9:00pm. Bring the family for a DJ/dance, hot dogs, chips, popcorn, and drinks.

June 14, 2014 – MORNING & AFTERNOON EVENTS

Start your morning with a 5k run! Registration begins at 7:00am, with the run scheduled to start at 8:00am. Registration fee is \$20.00.

Enjoy a day at the park from 10:00am to 4:00pm, with bounce houses, a dunk tank, face painting, games, Fire Safety House, Storm Troopers Star Wars group, and Monster Truck rides.

June 14, 2014 – EVENING EVENTS

At 4:00pm, head over to Main Street where you can purchase food prepared by our Thomasboro firefighters and take a stroll through the Fire Museum. The tent/gate opens at 4:00pm, with a \$5.00 cover charge for admission. Admission is only open to those 21 and older. Under the tent events include a concert by Marvin Lee from 5:00pm to 6:30pm, with Ryan Ideus and the Feudin' Hillbillies performing at 8:30pm.

T-shirts are being sold to commemorate the sesquicentennial of the Village of Thomasboro. T-shirts may be pre-ordered at Village Hall for \$20.00, payable upon placement of the order. Buy a shirt and wear it to the dance on Saturday night – you'll get in for free!

All proceeds from the event will support the Thomasboro Firefighters, the Thomasboro Improvement Association (TIA), and the Thomasboro Grade School.

SPRING COMMUNITY CLEANUP DAY – MAY 17

The Village Board has set our seasonal Community Cleanup for Saturday, May 17th, from 8:00am to 12:00 noon. The Village has been working very hard to clean up our community, and this is your opportunity to help us in our goal of making Thomasboro more attractive for residents and visitors alike. Dumpsters will be located at the water plant at 606 W. Central Avenue. This program is open to all Thomasboro residents, and participants will be required to show a current driver's license with a Village of Thomasboro address. Once again, we are asking participants for a freewill donation to help defray the costs of having the dumpsters and semi on site. Trustees will monitor dumpsters, as there are a few items which will not be permitted, i.e. hazardous chemicals, automobiles, tree limbs, yard waste and raw garbage. No one is to leave anything at the site before May 17th at 8:00 am or after the dumpsters have been filled and covered. Trustees ask that you enter from Schluter Street and exit from Central Avenue. TIRES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

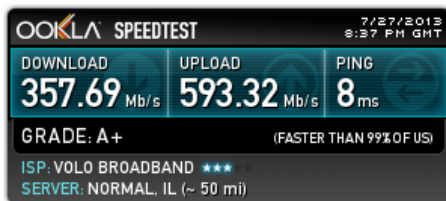

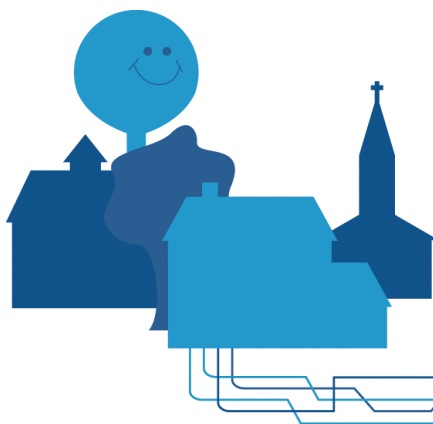
