#### VILLAGE CHANGES TO REPUBLIC SERVICES AS TRASH HAULER – OCT 1

Over the last several months, the Village Board has researched and solicited bids from several area trash collection companies and has now contracted with Republic Services to serve the Village of Thomasboro as its single residential trash collector. This change will take effect October 1<sup>st</sup> and the first pickup date will be Wednesday, October 5<sup>th</sup>.

The bill for the trash collection will now be part of your Village water bill each month. Republic will be delivering containers to each residence on or around September 26<sup>th</sup>. Representatives from Republic will be going around each neighborhood to explain the service and hand out information on how the containers should be placed on the street, pickup dates, etc. **Please** note that all containers will now need to be placed on the street side of your property for curbside pickup, as Republic trucks will be unable to pickup in alleyways.

The Village has been receiving numerous calls about this change and what it means for our residents. On the following pages, I have included information from Republic Services that covers most of the frequently asked questions that you can refer to as a guide. I did want to cover a couple of questions that are commonly asked:

"I already paid my trash service through the end of the year – what am I supposed to do?"

It will be your responsibility to contact your current trash hauler to cancel your service and to request a refund for any services that have already been paid.

#### "Does Republic Services offer recycling?"

Yes. They offer recycling, which will be picked up on a biweekly basis. You will not automatically receive a container for recycling. You will need to opt into the recycling program, but this can be done at any time just by contacting Republic. There is no additional charge for participating in the recycling.

# Village of Thomasboro IL have entered into a partnership for Waste/Recycling collection for IN TOWN Village of Thomasboro residents!

## What that means to you?

How do I sign up for Trash service? You don't need to. You will be auto enrolled, based on your address and water meter with the village.

What day will my waste be picked up? Wednesdays

What day will my recycling be picked up? Wednesdays - EVERY OTHER WEEK.

How do I know what Wednesday is the 'ON WEEK' for recycling? Below is a copy of the next 12 months to help explain services. Or, feel free to stop by Village hall for a calendar of collection!

How do I pay Republic? The charge will be on your Water bill, with services effective 10-1-16.

I have a different hauler today, what do I do? Call your hauler, let them know the village has entered into a municipal agreement, and cancel service effective 10.1.16. If you currently have service with Republic, Republic will close the account and continue services thru the municipal agreement.

When will I receive my garbage/recycling Toter from Republic?

- We plan on delivering the Waste toters the week of SEPTEMBER 26. If you don't receive one during that week, simply email/call us at 1-217-554-7007 or Thomasboro@republicservices.com
- If you have 'opted in' for Recycling services prior to 10/1/16, your recycle toter will be delivered to your home the same day as your waste toter. If you 'opt in' for recycling services after 10.1.16, you should receive your recycle toter within 1 week from requesting to start this service.

If I chose to not 'opt in' for recycling services at this time, can I 'opt in' at a later date?

Absolutely! Simply call 1-217-554-7007 and we will start your recycling services!

What is the first day of trash collection? Wednesday, October 5, 2016!

What is the first day of recycling collection (if I have 'opted in')? Wednesday, October 5, 2016!

What time do I need my toter(s) to be at the curb for collection? By 6am on your service day

Must I use the provided Toter for waste/recycling? Yes. Utilizing the toters allows for automated collection, improving efficiencies, productivity, and general aesthetics.

I'm in a town home/apartment, how does this affect me? Any dwellings with 4 or less units will be enrolled as part of the Municipal contract. Any dwellings with 5 or more units can contact Republic Services at 1-217-554-7007 for commercial services.

My house is outside city limits, does this affect me? No, but please contact Republic if you would like their services at 1-217-554-7007.

Can my container be put in the alley for collection? Sorry, we offer curbside collection and curbside is where your toters are needed for your waste and recycling to be collected. Please do not assume toters will be collected in the alley, as our trucks will not be collecting in the alley.

What if I can't wait for my next collection day for a pick up? Contact republic direct for an extra pick up.

What if I have waste outside the provided Republic Services toter? Simply call the Village office PRIOR to your service day. The information will be gathered, and sent to Republic in advance of collection.

If I need a 2<sup>nd</sup> waste or recycling toter, how to I get one? Simply contact village hall or Republic, and a delivery will be scheduled!

FOR OFFICE USE: Please remove plastic covers and steel binders.

#### **GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS ACCEPTED:**

Clear, brown, green and blue Please rinse

You DO NOT need to remove labels

No window glass, ceramics, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, drinking glasses, or dishes.

Note: With "Single Stream Recycling", all recyclable items can be commingled in the same recycling cart.

#### COMMUNITY WIDE TRASH COLLECTION DAY – OCTOBER 15

Once again, we are planning our community-wide trash collection day for the morning of October 15th, from 8:00am to 12:00pm. This is a service that we would really like to continue to offer our residents; however, it has been met with its challenges in the past. We are requesting that anyone dropping off trash on cleanup day provide a water bill or other current proof of residency in the Village of Thomasboro to ensure that we are only serving our residents. We also ask that residents bring a *reasonable* amount of trash to the site. In years past, people have brought large amounts of trash and debris from personal construction projects which then limits our available space and the amount of residents we can serve. The Village will no longer be providing pick-up service from resident's home on this date. With Republic Services being contracted as our community trash hauler as of October 1<sup>st</sup>, residents can always contact Republic Services (<a href="mailto:Thomasboro@republicservices.com">Thomasboro@republicservices.com</a> or 217-554-7007) and they will be able to pick up large or bulk items upon request. (Additional fees will apply.) As always, we do not require payment for the community cleanup service, but any cash donations would be greatly appreciated to help offset our costs for providing the service.

#### VILLAGE BOARD MEETINGS

The regular board meetings of the Thomasboro Village Board are held the first Monday of each month, at 7:00 pm, at the Village Hall, located at 101 Main Street (Gifford State Bank Building). Visitors are always welcome.

#### VILLAGE BOARD ELECTION – APRIL 2017

Beginning September 20, Thomasboro residents interested in serving the community as a member of the Village Board of Trustees may pick up petition forms to become a candidate in the April 4, 2017 local election. Voters will be electing a Village President and three Village Trustee positions for four-year terms. To be eligible to run for office, you must be a registered voter having maintained a permanent residence in the Village of Thomasboro for at least 1 year before the date of the election. The period for filing petitions for office will begin at 8:00am on December 12, 2016 and will end at 5:00pm on December 19, 2016. #### SECOND WATER METERS

With colder weather approaching, residents with second water meters are reminded to bring those meters inside during the winter months to prevent freeze damage. The second meters are your property and you are responsible for their maintenance – so please take care of them.

#### BRUSH AND YARD WASTE DISPOSAL

After much discussion, the Village Board has decided that residents <u>will no longer be permitted</u> to continue using the "dump site" off of North Thomas Street for the disposal of tree limbs, brush and other landscape waste.

#### **COMMUNITY GARAGE SALE – OCTOBER 8**

The Thomasboro Community Garage Sale will be held on Saturday, October 8<sup>th</sup>. The Village will be handling the advertising for the event; however, you may also place your own advertisement if you like. There is no need to register your sale. Participants are encouraged to mark their garage sales with balloons or signs tied to your mailboxes or lamp posts to help draw attention to your sale. We hope that everyone has a successful sale!

#### PARKING ORDINANCE CHANGES

With the winter months approaching, the Village of Thomasboro wants to remind all residents of our winter parking restrictions. No vehicles will be permitted to park on any Village street following a snowfall of 2 inches or more. These restrictions are in place to allow for Village personnel to easily clear roadways without obstruction.

<u>Parking on Private Property</u>: No vehicles shall be parked on private property except on a weed-free surface made of gravel, crushed stone, asphalt, Portland cement concrete or brick pavers. No person shall park any motor vehicle in the yard of any lot containing a structure except on a weed-free surface.

<u>Parking in Excess of 72 hours:</u> Parking any vehicle in excess of 72 consecutive hours on any street, alleyway or Village-owned parking lot is prohibited. Moving the vehicle to a different location on the same street, alleyway or parking lot does not restart or extend the 72-hour parking limitation.

#### WATER MAIN FLUSHING

Village personnel will be flushing water mains from October 3<sup>rd</sup> through October 7<sup>th</sup>. During this process, residents should not be alarmed if they notice a slight discoloration in the water as a result of the flushing. The condition is temporary and should clear shortly thereafter.

## THOMASBORO POLICE DEPARTMENT PRESENTS: HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

#### **CHILDREN SHOULD:**

- Carry a flashlight
- Walk, don't run
- Stay on sidewalks
- Obey traffic signs
- Stay in familiar neighborhoods
- Don't cut across yards or driveways
- Wear a watch you can read in the dark
- Make sure costumes don't drag on the ground
- Shoes should fit (even if they don't go with your costume)
- Avoid wearing masks while walking from house to house
- Carry only flexible knives, swords or other props
- Walk on the left side of the road facing traffic (WHERE THERE ARE NO SIDEWALKS)
- Wear clothing with reflective markings or tape
- Approach only houses that are lit

#### **PARENTS SHOULD:**

- Make your child eat dinner before setting out
- Children should carry quarters so they can call home
- Ideally, young children of any age should be accompanied by an adult
- If your children go on their own, be sure they wear a watch, preferably one that can be read
  in the dark
- If you buy a costume, look for one made of flame-retardant material
- Older children should know where to reach you and when to be home
- You should know where your children are going
- Although tampering is rare, tell children to bring the candy home to be inspected before consuming anything

#### **HOMEOWNERS:**

- Make sure your yard is clear of such things as ladders, hoses, dog leashes and flower pots that can trip young ones
- Battery-powered jack o' lantern candles are preferable to real flame
- If you use candles, place the pumpkin well away from where trick-or-treaters will be walking or standing
- Make sure paper or cloth yard decorations won't be blown into a flaming candle
- Healthy food alternatives for trick-or-treaters include: sealed packages of low-fat crackers with cheese or peanut butter filling; single-serve boxes of cereal; packaged fruit rolls; mini boxes of raisins; and single-serve packets of low-fat popcorn that can be microwaved later
- Non-food treats to consider: plastic rings, pencils, stickers, erasers
